I look forward to seeing you soon.








#### School Aims

### Pastoral Care






End of Key Stage data indicates that more of our children leave school at or above the expected standard the Northern Ireland average.

# Foundation stage





### Arrange to Visit Our School





#### Consultations and Reports

Parents are invited to attend two Parent-Teacher Consultations each year once during the first term and a second in term two. This ensures that there is a strong bond between home and school and, if the situation warrants it, further meetings can be arranged. Additionally, an annual report written by the class teacher and issued to the parents in June. These measures are designed to ensure that a steady stream of information is sent to our parents throughout the year, keeping them involved with their child's education. It also raises substantial sums of money to provide books and equipment for the school.

#### <u>Transport</u>

#### **Charges and Remissions**


We provide a free education for all pupils at Upper Ballyboley Primary School under the Education Reform Order 1989.

There a just a few exceptions and these are detailed below;

- -All board, lodging and travel costs on residential trips (except where statutory/remissions apply)
- -Costs associated with optional extras, for example, visits to the theatre or extra-curricular activities.
- -Tuition in a musical instrument/swimming instructions.

The school may occasionally ask for voluntary donations but it is stressed that no child will be disadvantaged in any way if the parents choose not to make a contribution. 


The school day ends at 1400 for all children on Friday.

# Curriculum




As a controlled school we follow the Northern Ireland Curriculum. Our teachers employ a range of teaching methods and differentiated teaching to facilitate the needs of every child.


# Religious Education

# Physical Education




Physical education is taught as a separate area within the curriculum and through it we hope to provide Opportunities for the physical development, health and well-being of the children.

Our school's Extracurricular programme also provides opportunities for the children to extend and develop skills and interests acquired during P.E. lessons.




# Drugs Education



Drugs Education will be delivered within specific curricular areas such as The World Around Us, R.E., Literacy and Personal Development and Mutual Understanding.


The school will also avail of appropriate external agencies to deliver a drugs awareness programme, where appropriate. The school has a policy in place and this may be obtained from the school office or school website.

# Gifted and Talented




The school recognises that a small percentage of pupils will be gifted or talented. Any child identified with an exceptional ability will be nurtured and supported appropriately.




